





151 Applicants from 8 of 9 counties:


- 50% Asian

- 3% Other




Course Completion

- Compensated at living wage (\$25 per hour)


Students Had a Positive Experience

50% said "Excellent," and received the highest scores so far.




Learning About Government

High School

- Focus on Equity Priority communities and partnerships with local high schools

College

- Research and discuss potential for a year-round college intern program
- Look at Apprenticeship programs that might offer a different pathway for young adults
